RCMP/HRR onclude investigation into alleged abuse of former residents of Nova Scotia Homefor Colored Children

TheIntegratedRCMP/HRPhvestigationTeamhasconcludedtheir investigationinto allegations of physicaland sexual abuse of former residents of the NovaScotia Homefor Colored Children.

In March 2012, the RCMPand HRP released a statement encouraging individuals with direct information on alleged abuse to come forward to speak with police. An investigative team was formed shortly after to focus solely on these allegations. We understand that a significant period of time has passed ince the sealleged instances of abuse took place and it may have been difficult for people to discust his very challenging ime in their lives. However, we were encouraged by the number of people that came forward to speak with police. The team did an exceptional job conducting a thorough investigation and various avenues available for investigative perusal were examined.

Theinvestigative eam traveled throughout NovaScotia, New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario and Albertato personally interview 40 complainants Possible witnesses and those with potential information on the allegations were also interviewed in an effort to corroborate statements and garner further evidence.

charges It is important to understand that in order for police to lay charges in any investigation these grounds must be supported by evidence that will with stand the scrutiny of the
